

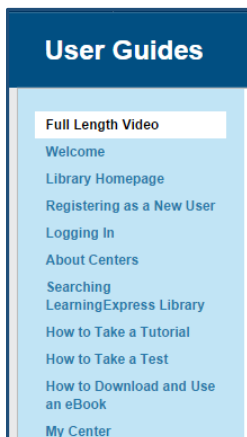
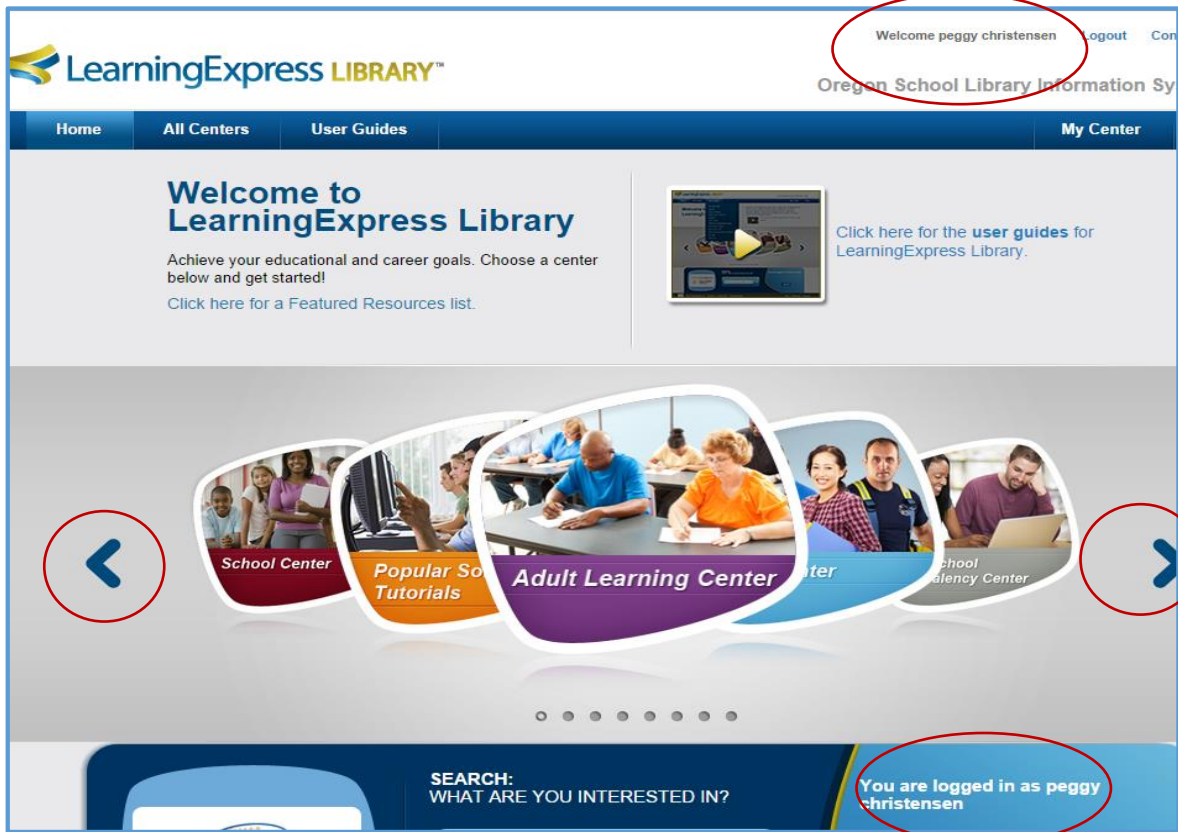
Information Sheet

To create an account in Learning Express Library you have to have an email address. You will enter it when you register and select a password. That is all you have to do.

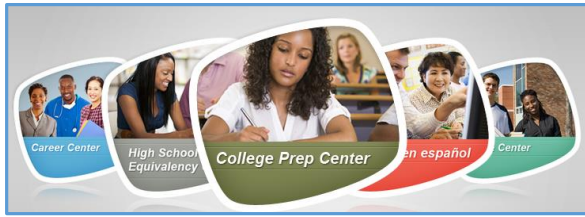

When you return to LEL you will login. There are two places on the screen that show you are in your own account.

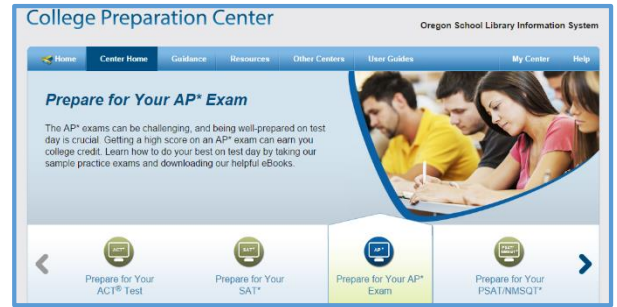
Use the arrows on the module carousel to select the module you want.



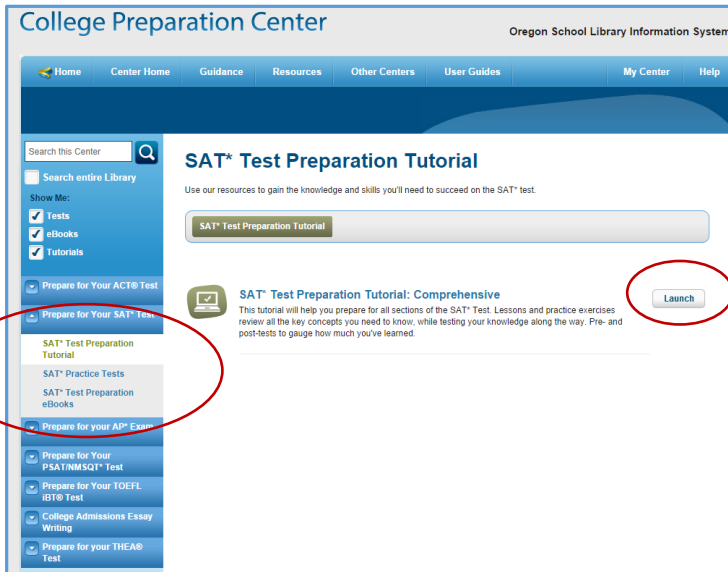

The college Prep Center is the module to use to prepare for the SAT and the ACT

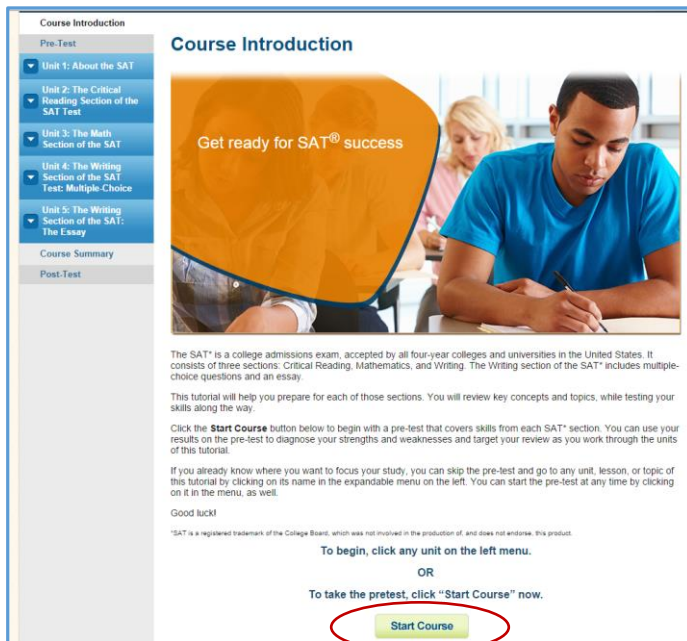


Select the module you want. The example shows the **SAT Test** preparation tutorial was selected.

How long are the tests?

The Pre-Test is timed.

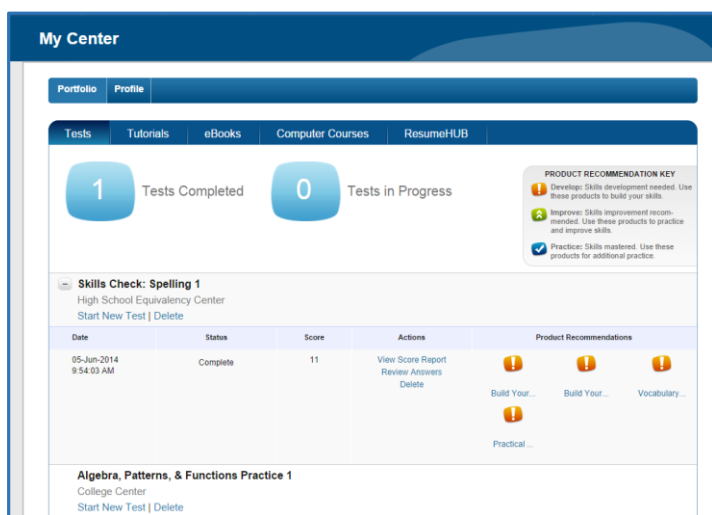

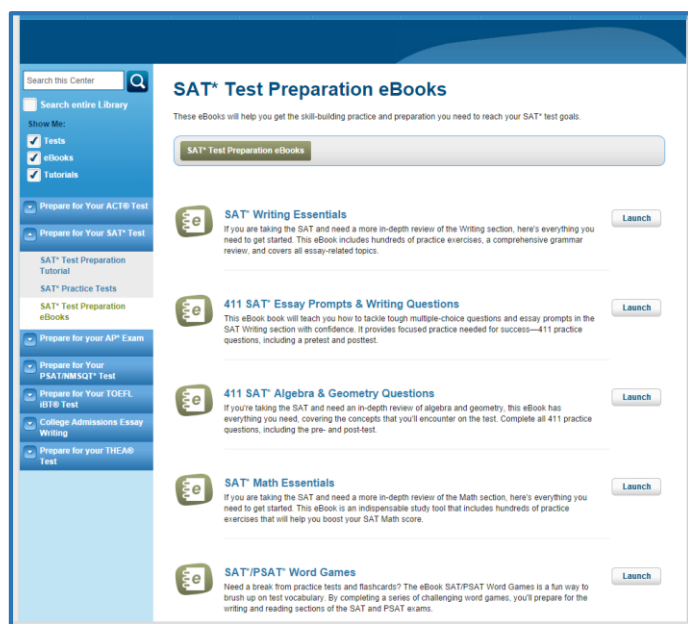
Tests can be saved and finish later. Another option is to exit without saving. Choosing this 2nd option brings up the following WARNING.

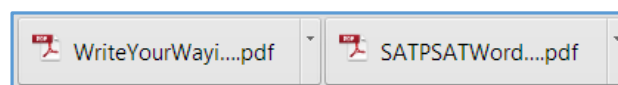


My Center – is unique to the user. This is where individual information is stored. It is also private in the high school setting. In a University setting, the **My Center** information may be accessed by the institution.



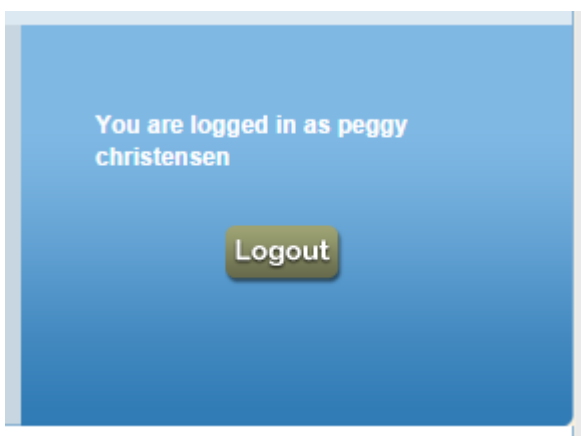
The College Prep Center module also provides **SAT Test Preparation eBooks**.
