This last weekend ten Marshfield students traveled to the University of Portland to compete in the annual Science Bowl competition. The Science Bowl is approximately 300 students from about 40 schools coming together to compete in teams within two separate competitions. The first competition is a speed trivia-based competition; the second is an engineering design competition.

Speed Trivia results: Each of our two teams decently represented Marshfield, placing average among the schools present. Among our students, Justin Coplin had a strong showing and answered more questions correctly than any other.

Engineering Design results: Marshfield students regrouped into three teams for this part. Each team was given 90 minutes to design and build a model for a proposed emergency housing design that could be employed for homeless individuals in times of poor weather. They were given a list of criteria that must be met, including feasibility, functionality, cost effectiveness, and aesthetics. They then had to 'sell' their proposal to the judges.
