The Driver Education program is a self-supporting program. The cost of the program is shared by the student tuition and state reimbursement. To be eligible for state reimbursement, thus receiving the listed tuition price, the student must be between the ages of 15-17 and have a valid Oregon permit. If a student is 18 years old, and/or turns 18 prior to completing the program, they are NOT eligible for state reimbursement and must pay the additional tuition amount of \$210.

**Students who can provide proof of free/reduced lunch are eligible to receive a \$75 Discount.
